UPPER MILFORD HISTORICAL SOCIETY 2016 CALENDAR OF EVENTS

Members and friends of the Upper Milford Historical Society can look forward to a line up of interesting programs in 2016. There are varied topics of historical interest featuring presentations by our own members as well as programs by known authorities that promote the society's mission – "to preserve, research, and educate about the culture and traditions of the Township."

On March 31 David Venditta of the Morning Call and author of War Stories in *Their Own Words* will share some of the interviews and stories he has collected. Veterans and those from Upper Milford with military experiences to relate are encouraged to attend and add to the discussion.

For April 28 barn historian and preservationist, Jeffrey Marshall, will talk about barn preservation and land conservancy. With well over 120 barns photographed by the Historical Society in our predominately rural Township, we know this topic is very appropriate for residents of Upper Milford.

May 26 brings our own Township Manager Dan DeLong in a different roll. Dan has been a participant since 2009 in guiding school students around the wondrous sights and outdoor experiences in Alaska. Don't miss his photo journey of these adventures.

Member Frank Willis is a talented and award winning powder horn and bag artisan who has researched a ton of information about early life on the frontier. He also reenacts that rugged frontier lifestyle periodically. On June 30 Frank will talk about the historical aspects of and techniques employed by the early craftsmen.

With long daylight hours and hot weather, our annual outdoor picnic event is set for July 28 at Jasper Park. Everyone contributes a covered dish. Therefore, we all over indulge from all the picnic goodies. Then Bob Thomas and John Fegley help us recover by reminding us of the huge historical significance of the Lenape people as represented by the jasper pits in the park. The more adventurous members may even walk to visit the pits.

On August 25 Simonee deFuccio-Marhefka will give us a look at the life and times of *Uncle Jerry Roth: Father of the Great Allentown Fair*- just in time for the annual fair to take place! Simonee authored this historical book that includes her family connections to the fair's founder.

In the fall when the essence of Lenape roots in Upper Milford surrounds us, on September 29 we are excited and privileged to have Shelly DePaul, who serves as Chief on the Council of the Lenape Nation, give a very personal accounting of Lenape history in Pennsylvania – not possible by reading a textbook. Don't miss Shelly's time with us!

We complete 2016 on October 27 with our customary Pennsylvania Dutch program. Who do you get to present a program about Pennsylvania Dutch culture? Of course Patrick Donmoyer, head of the Pennsylvania German Cultural Center in Kutztown! From his deep PA Dutch expertise, this year Patrick will talk about barn stars, which are not the same as hex signs. Another program not to miss!

You won't miss any of these programs if you set aside the last Thursday of the month at 7 p.m. in the Township Building for the Upper Milford Historical Society meeting.

Call Pennsylvania One Call System, Inc. (POCS) three business days before you dig at 800-242-1776 or 8-1-1.


PA Act 287 as amended requires excavators as well as private landowners to call POCS three days prior to any type of digging occurring with powered equipment.

Mark your excavation area in white paint before calling with a dig notification.

By calling you allow the facility owners the opportunity to locate and mark their underground facility in advance of the planned excavation (gas and liquid pipelines will mark underground facilities using yellow stakes, flags or paint.)

PERMITS REQUIRED

Upper Milford Township is a zoned community. The following are required:

- Bonfire Permit: required at least 10 days in advance of the proposed bonfire.
- Building and/or Zoning Permit: required for new construction, additions, or alterations to exterior of existing structures; deck, patio, pool, spa or hot tub; electrical work or wiring; plumbing and HVAC work; and shed.
- Driveway Permit: required for the construction of a driveway or other means of ingress or egress onto a Township or PennDOT road.

- Fence or Wall Permit: required for the installation of any fence or wall over two feet high.
- Grading Permit: required if not in conjunction with another permit.
- Moving Permit: required when moving into, out of or within Upper Milford Township. There is no fee for this permit.
- Occupancy Permit: required prior to occupying a newly constructed building.
- Park Permit: required in order to reserve a pavilion in a township park.
- Peddler's Permit: must be obtained before engaging in solicitation or peddling in Upper Milford Township.

- Sewage Permit: required for the inspection of a new septic system and for the repair or enlargement of an existing system.
- Tree cutting and Logging Permit: required if more than 10 trees/year or more than 30 percent of total number of trees on lot are taken down. Call the Township office for specific information.
- Use or Change of Use: required for any activity, occupation, business, or operation carried on or intended to be carried on in a structure or lot.

Other permits may be required for certain activities. For specific information call 610-966-3223.

Macungie Ambulance Corps 🔀

Macungie Ambulance Corps celebrates 60 years of providing service to the community.


In 1955 several community members recognized the need for an ambulance service in Macungie and the surrounding area. In that first year, members created a schedule of what they called "sleeping" teams and responded to 50 calls for service in a 1948 Packard. In the decades that followed, countless individuals would volunteer their time to serve others as members of the Macungie Ambulance Corps.

As years and decades passed, the needs of our community grew. Teams of volunteers "sleeping" at the ambulance station evolved into nurses and other individuals trained in first aid and CPR responding to calls for assistance in ambulances stocked with life-saving equipment.

As the community has grown; the ambulance corps has grown to match the need. Today the Macungie Ambulance Corps responds to over 3,500 emergency calls annually with a mix of paid and volunteer staff. We operate four Advanced Life Support ambulances as well as several specialty vehicles.

In addition to responding to 911 calls, the Macungie Ambulance corps is well known as a regional leader in community outreach in education. We train over 1,000 community members every year in first aid, CPR, and AED use.

OPEN BURNING REMINDER

pen burning is permitted within the Township. Below are some important regulations set in place to promote safety while carrying out any open burning activity:

- 1. The burn shall not be conducted on Sunday or any holiday recognized by the Township.
- 2. The burn shall not take place before sunrise or after sunset and be completely extinguished, including smoldering, by sunset.
- 3. The burn shall not include materials from a commercial, industrial or other similar non-residential use, including but not limited to, any materials from the salvaging, construction, and/or demolition of any structure.
- 4. The use of petroleum-based products as accelerants is prohibited.

- 5. No open burning shall be permitted within any street right-of-way, gutter, or swale.
 - 6. No burn shall produce malodorous fumes detectible beyond the property line.
 - 7. The burn is attended at all times by a person 18 years of age or older.
 - 8. Fire extinguisher, water hose, dirt, sand, or other fire extinguishing equipment shall be readily available at the site of the burn.
 - 9. All items burned shall be readily combustible.

The Township always stresses the use of caution when carrying out any open burning activity.

Septic System Care And Helpful Tips: Septic system Dos and Don'ts

Do: Learn the location of your septic system.

Do: Have your septic system inspected annually.

Do: Have your septic system pumped out by a licensed contractor in accordance to the chart below.

Do: Keep your septic tank cover accessible.

Do: Conserve water to avoid overloading the system.

Do: Divert other sources of water, like roof drains and sump pumps from the septic system. Excessive water keeps the soil in the drain field from naturally cleansing the wastewater.

Don't: Drive or park over any part of the system.

Don't: Plant anything over or near the drain field except grass. Root systems from trees and shrubs may clog and damage the drain lines.

Don't: Dig in your drain field or build anything over it.

Don't: Use septic tank additives. These products may be harmful to your system.

Don't: Use your toilet as a trash can or poison your septic system and the groundwater by pouring harmful chemicals and cleansers down the drain.

Estimated septic tank pumping frequencies in years. These figures assume there is no garbage disposal unit in use. If one is in use, pumping frequency may need to be increased.

Upper Milford Township is offering residents a fee-based roadside yard waste collection program as a supplement to the Township's Yard Waste Drop-Off site program.

Yard Waste Drop Off Site Information:

The Township accepts yard waste dropped off by residents at the Township's Yard Waste Drop Off area behind the Township's Garage, accessed via Church View Road. Materials may only be dropped off by Township residents and this service is not offered to lawn maintenance or landscape businesses.

Grass, leaves, and brush or branches must be kept separated and unloaded at the appropriate location as identified by the signage at the site.

Branches are limited to 4" diameter and must be no longer than 8'.

Hours of operations are Wednesday from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. and Saturday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and Sunday 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Fall hours not including holidays beginning October 14th through December 13th are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday 8:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m., Wednesday 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. or dusk, and Saturday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., and Sunday 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Call the office at (610) 966-3223 for additional information.

The Township, at times, has a supply of coarse wood mulch available to the public. Residents may load their own vehicles or the Township may load your truck or trailer by appointment only for a fee of \$5.00 per scoop or part thereof. Appointment hours are based on employee availability. Please call to schedule loading service.


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
