Emmaus Library:

Lisa Marten gave a report for the Library. 03/05 is SnowBlast with storytelling, block party, snow flake crafts and the showing of Frozen II. The question was asked about the grant the Library received. Lisa explained that the grant was to enable the Library to become a "Family Place". This is geared toward family and children with parenting books, early childhood programing and materials.

Recreation Commission: No Report

Township Manager:

Bud Carter – Vera Cruz Rd Bridge project will be detouring traffic starting March 16 through approximately November 2022.

Supervisors:

John D. Zgura – Supervisor Zgura has been looking into the Veterans Memorials. He would like to offer to help clean and repair them but didn't want to upset anyone without asking and researching who is responsible for them first. Supervisor Mohr reported that the Vera Cruz Memorial was taken care of by the Vera Cruz Community Association and a member a few doors down replaces the flags and cleans up periodically. Supervisor Zgura stated he will continue to research how he can help with the two existing memorials and proposes to create a memorial at the Township building in two phases. First for Veterans and second for emergency responders. He wants to do this 100% through donations and volunteer work.

Joyce K. Moore - Supervisor Moore read a letter submitted by the Library Director

Good evening, I am the director of the Emmaus Public Library. I heard that there were questions raised at the last meeting about the library and its finances. I was not present at that meeting, so I would like to present some facts to address any concerns that the public may have. Here is a summary:

Upper Milford Township contracts yearly with Emmaus Public Library to provide materials and services to its residents. The library director, in return, personally emails the township manager and secretary the library board's agenda, minutes, director's report, statistics and financial statements every month. These documents are shared with the township supervisors. Upper Milford also has two seats on the library board. The 501c3 nonprofit public library falls under the umbrella of the state Department of Education and is overseen by the Bureau of Commonwealth Libraries. The library is also audited yearly as it receives some state funds. This audit is submitted to the state.

The local and state funds cover about 60% of the library's yearly operating costs, which include payroll, utilities, and more. The Friends of the Library nonprofit fundraises 10% and the other 30% comes from donations and grants. In December of 2021, the library received both a grant that will be spent in 2022 and an estate that will provide much needed updates as per the library's Long Range Plan to the 1966 building.

Other local libraries receive monies through resident tax and/or school districts. Emmaus Public Library receives neither, and therefore has a lower budget than some of its neighbor libraries.

The state library oversees the libraries and has codes that the libraries must follow; for example, 12% of the library's budget must be spent on materials for the community, and the library must be open at least 45 hours weekly including at least 7 hours on weekends. Also, the director must complete an annual report on all of the library's activities: hours, funds, collections, statistics, programs, and more.

Public libraries are required by both state and Emmaus Borough ordinances to provide library services free of charge. Public libraries were founded on providing equal access to information for everyone, no matter what their financial status. Public libraries also decrease the digital divide by providing free computers and wi-fi, technology classes and assistance.

The nine volunteer members of the library board employ a director, who is a professional librarian which requires a master's degree, as required by the state. I also have 20 years of experience working in libraries. In 2021, I brought in \$34,000 worth of grants: \$20,000 from Trexler Trust to replace carpet, \$10,000 from ARP Lehigh County to replace technology furniture, \$2500 from BB&T Foundation & \$1500 from Ocean Spray for the Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics (STEM) workstation in the teen area.

The director employs 3 full-time (35 hours+ weekly) staff, and 7 part-time staff. None of the staff, including the director, receive healthcare benefits. The library also has numerous volunteers who work the front desk, shelve books, process and repair books, and more. These volunteers save the library, and therefore the community, quite a bit of money.

The library suspended in-person events in January during the height of the pandemic, but is back to in-person events such as story times and book clubs as of February. Some online events

remain for those who are not able to or prefer not to travel to the library. The online events are free through the ZOOM platform.

The library buys materials at a discount and then those items circulate many times. The library has saved money by joining a local cooperative Lehigh Carbon County Cooperative (LCLC) that promotes resource sharing among 12 libraries with an open source platform. Summer interns are funded through CareerlinkLV.

Upper Milford residents have checked out 19,801 physical items in the past year. 2260 residents of Upper Milford hold an active library card. 55 residents participated in the Summer Reading Club.

As of September 2021, Emmaus Public Library expanded its hours to include Fridays for the first time in over a decade. EPL is now open 54 hours a week, the 3rd most hours open amongst the area libraries. EPL has 87,000+ items, the largest collection amongst the LCLC libraries.

While the library has many books (over 80,000!), it also lends other items. Physical items include: DVDs, CD books, CD music, magazines, totes for book clubs, seeds, museum passes, travel brochures, and jigsaw puzzles. E-resources include: e-books, e-audiobooks, e-magazines, Rosetta Stone online, Ancestry.com in library, and more! Outreach includes a book drop at the township building and Upper Milford Community Day. Libraries are no longer dusty book depositories, but rather community centers.

In closing, libraries are one of the last places indoors that people can spend time free of charge. Like schools, not all members of the community may choose to use them, but libraries improve residents' quality of life. I invite you to stop by the library or signup for a card online. Libraries serve their communities.
