1. Board of Supervisor's Authorization to Sell Obsolete Equipment

He requested permission to post the item on Municibid. If the Public Works Department needs to use an air compressor in the future, they will rent one. Manager DeLong responded to a question from Resident Phil Casey regarding the engine type in the compressor, which is an International Harvester Gas Engine

MOTION:

Supervisor Sentner made the motion to direct staff to advertise the 1969 Ingersoll-Rand Towable Air Compressor on Munici-bid. Supervisor DeVault seconded the motion. Any questions or comments, all were in favor, and the motion carried.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS:

Manager DeLong stated that CS-Graphx installed the Permit Management Software. He feels it will be a great asset to the Township in the years to come once everything gets underway. Every property in the Township will have its own electronic file. Resident James Krippe asked if there is a fail safe system in the instance of a disgruntled employee. Manager DeLong explained that the system will be backed up weekly so no more than a week would be lost. Resident Phil Casey asked if the database of information would be able to be sold; he asked if the Township should adopt a resolution protecting against the sale of the database. Manager DeLong explained that under the Pennsylvania Right to Know

laws, all of the information is public information anyways; anyone filling out a Right to Know request can have access to the information.
