SPECIAL PRESENTATION:

- 1.) Spotted Lanternfly: life cycle, control measures and quarantine rules
 - a. Presented by John Baker and Sven Spichiger of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture (PDA)

Highlighted points of presentation: The Spotted Lanternfly was first discovered in Berks County, Pennsylvania in 2014. It is native to Asia and prefers the Ailanthus Tree (Tree of Heaven) for feeding and mating purposes. The female Spotted Lanternfly will lay eggs on various smooth surfaces, so residents of Upper Milford Township were urged to thoroughly check their vehicles and any other items that are planned for transport before leaving the quarantined area. Landscapers, timber harvesters, and nurseries have been contacted; bee keepers will also now be notified, prompted by a question from Manager, DeLong. Residents were urged to contact the PDA upon spotting any Spotted Lanternflies.
